

The Canadian Technical Asphalt Association's (CTAA) formation meeting was held in Victoria British Columbia, Canada, in October 1955.

Forty-eight people were in attendance and agreed to form an association of asphalt industry professionals. The Association continues to meet every year, and has grown to include a general membership of over 600 from across

Canada, the United States, and internationally.

The CTAA is Canada's link to the international asphalt community and is the ONLY Canadian forum dedicated to asphalt materials and mixtures, products and their design, manufacturing and



construction processes, and related technologies.

The primary objectives of the Association are to:

- > provide a technical society that encourages the exchange of information on characteristics and uses of asphalt materials and related topics between its Members, and between various segments of the asphalt industry;
- > organize the efforts of its Membership on a nonprofit, public service basis to assemble, correlate and disseminate technical information on the characteristics and uses of asphalt materials;
- > conduct conferences at which the characteristics and uses of asphalt materials are discussed;
- > stimulate and encourage research on the characteristics and uses of asphalt materials.

Association is available to any individual who is experienced or interested in the characteristics and uses of asphalt materials. Sustaining Membership is available to any individual, firm, corporation, agency of government or other organization wishing to provide greater support to the Association through the payment of slightly higher dues. Student Membership is available to an individual who is a full-time student at an accredited post-secondary institution whose studies involve asphalt technology.
