# **CAMEP Ending**

The Canadian Asphalt Mix Exchange Program, CAMEP, is a program targeted at laboratories in Canada that perform tests on bituminous materials. This program offers participants the opportunity to compare their results with those of other laboratories carrying out similar tests. It provides a mechanism for evaluating and improving testing methods.

Unfortunately, due to a decrease in the number of participants, the 2015 edition of CAMEP will be the last one. The binder part, CAEP, was cancelled earlier this year because less than 10 laboratories registered for it. CAMEP and CAEP were managed by the Saskatchewan Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure for many years and both programs were managed by Ecole de technologie superieure for the last four years.

### In Memorium: J. Keith Davidson

The Canadian Technical Asphalt Association lost a key member of our industry on February 13, 2015, when Keith Davidson unexpectedly passed away at the age of 64.

Keith was a long-time employee of McAsphalt Industries Limited where he was the Director of Technology and Product Development. Keith was extremely active in our industry serving on the CTAA Board as President in 1996, and presenting courses to CTAA delegates at several conferences. Keith was also an active participant in the old CGSB Committee on Road Materials: the Asphalt Emulsion Manufacturers Association's International Technical Committee and various subcommittees of the ASTM Committee on Road Materials. Keith was also a long-time member of our

sister association, AAPT.







Keith was made an honorary member of CTAA on May 15, 2010.

Keith will be remembered for his open sharing of technical information which exemplifies the goals of CTAA: to disseminate information on asphalt technology for the betterment of the industry. His warm nature was particularly noted by new CTAA members as Keith went out of his way to make them feel welcome. Mentored himself by the late Norman W. McLeod, Keith passed on his knowledge freely. He willingly shared his time and technical know-

how with his staff and colleagues as well as clients and industry partners. His practical approach combined with his technical expertise earned him the respect of a wide audience in the asphalt field. He was especially recognized in the areas where he advanced the use of emulsified asphalts such as Cold-In-Place Recycling, Full-Depth Reclamation, and Micro-Surfacing.

In sharing his knowledge, Keith authored or co-authored over 30 technical papers published in CTAA Proceedings, as well as many, many others published in other technical arenas.

## Cold-In-Place Recycling

In this course Reza Namjouy and Tom Dziedziejko will present the basic considerations for designing cold-inplace and full depth recycled pavements. Both Tom and Reza bring years of practical experience and observations to help bring an understanding of the impact of lab results compared to real-world performance. The use of both emulsified and foamed asphalts and the potential benefits when choosing either product with the different processes will be discussed. The presenters will provide an overview of the Wirtgen design procedure and explore areas such as the practical significance of retained stabilities, the benefits of cement addition and other nuances of the design procedures. They will also address pavement design and candidate selection considerations as well as provide practical guidance regarding construction processes and quality management from the design stage through project completion.

This short course will be of interest to practitioners at all levels of experience with CIR and FDR processes. Course discussion will be encourages to share experiences with both construction and performance considerations.

The scholarships are described below.

# CTAA Graduate Scholarship \$2,000

The CTAA Graduate Scholarship will be presented to a student who has been admitted into, or is currently enrolled in, a Canadian university program leading to a post-graduate degree which contributes to advances in any facet of asphalt technology. Eligible fields of study include chemistry, chemical engineering, and construction or civil engineering. Other areas of study may be considered provided the applicant clearly notes the relevance of his/her curriculum towards asphalt technology.

# CTAA Undergraduate Scholarship \$2,000

The CTAA Undergraduate Scholarship will be presented to a student who has been admitted into, or is currently enrolled in a Canadian university program leading to an undergraduate degree which contributes to advances in any facet of asphalt technology. Eligible fields of study include chemistry, chemical engineering, and construction or civil engineering. Other areas of study may be considered provided the applicant clearly notes the relevance of his/her curriculum towards asphalt technology.

# CTAA Applied Technology Scholarship \$2,000

The CTAA Applied Technology Scholarship will be presented to a student who has been admitted into, or is currently enrolled in, Canadian technical college or a community college program leading to a diploma which contributes to advances in any facet of asphalt technology. Eligible fields of study include chemistry, chemical engineering, and construction or civil engineering technology. Other areas of study may be considered provided the applicant clearly notes the relevance of his/her curriculum towards asphalt technology. Applicants with industrial experience in asphalt technology are encouraged to apply.
